



TRIAGE TRAUMATIC DENTAL INJURIES: CPR FOR PERMANENT & PRIMARY TEETH



Dr. Kaneta R. Lott has helped to shape the smiles of hundreds of children. A board certified pediatric dentist, she earned her Doctor of Dental Surgery from Emory University. Dr. Lott is a Fellow in the American College of Dentists and the International College of Dentists. She has served as an Assistant Clinical Professor at The Medical College of Georgia, Department of Pediatric Dentistry. Her private practice of pediatric and orthodontic dentistry opened in 1984 in Atlanta, Georgia where she continues to provide excellent care for her patients. Dr. Lott speaks on Pediatric Dental Health and Dental Traumatology to national and international audiences.

This course explores the skills needed to provide traumatic dental care to adults as well as the immature permanent teeth that require specialized treatment from the triage dentist and the endodontist. Because traumatic injuries have been researched extensively for more than 50 years, the pathway to a good prognosis oftentimes lies in the general dentist's hands. These dentists are called upon by the patients

initially. The primary care dentists need to act quickly and skillfully because triage treatment determines the prognosis. For that reason, the attendees will receive a pre-packaged supply list of items needed in an emergency kit. The kit will ensure that the dentists are prepared to treat unexpected traumatic injuries. This course is very valuable to staff members as well as dentists.
